Happy December! Welcome to our last three weeks before Christmas break.

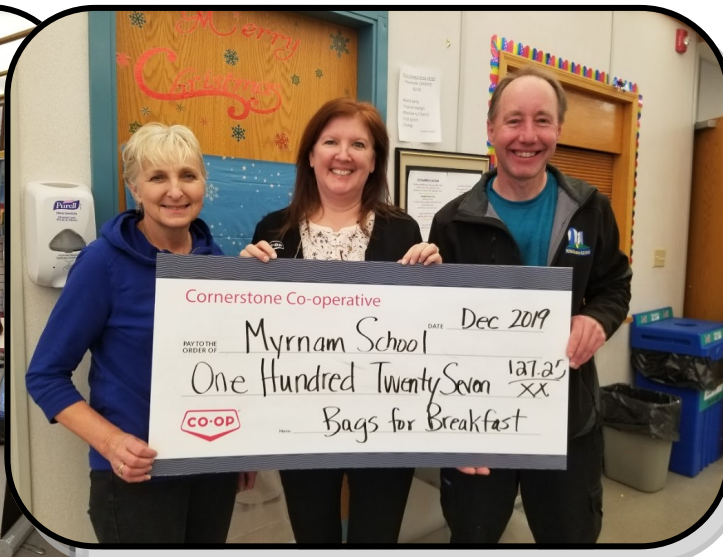

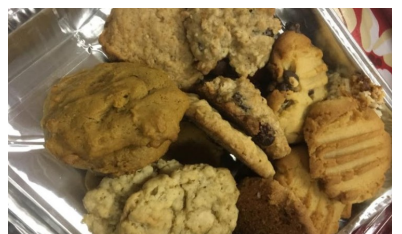

Remembrance Day

Videos and poems were shared including a poem shared by the grade 6 class and a song from the grade 3 and 4 music students. Last Post and Reveille were played and two minutes of silence was practiced. The two minutes are a time to reflect and pause to honour, thank, and remember the Fallen. This was followed by a wreath laying ceremony where student representatives from Kindergarten to grade 12 walked a wreath to be laid at the head of the gym. 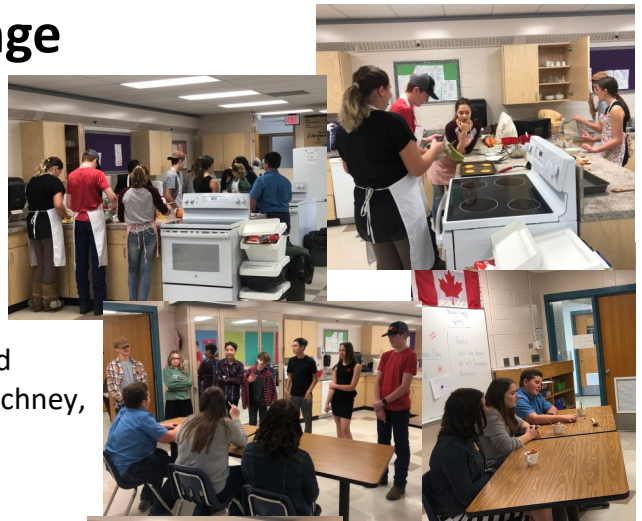
Babysitters and Stay Safe Course

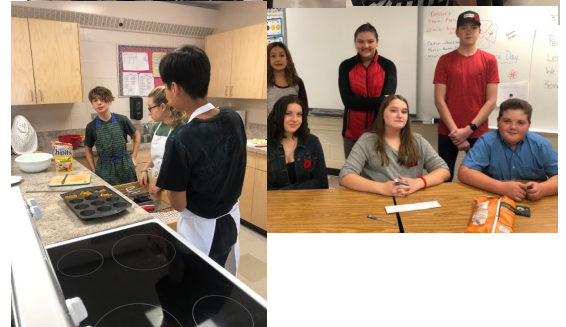
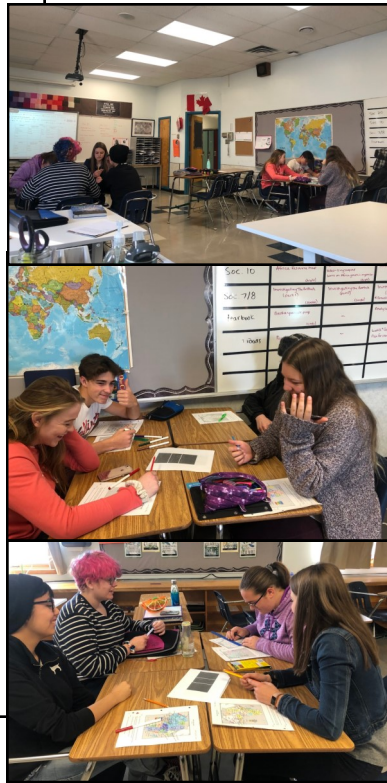
Jr. High Foods Chopped Challenge

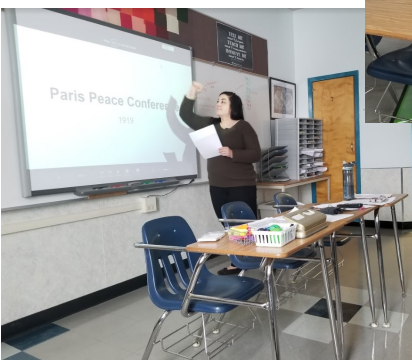
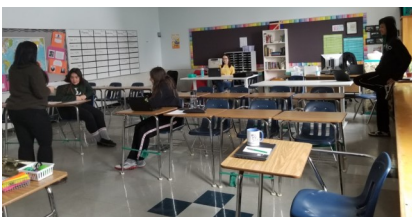
Social 10 - Scramble for Africa

Students each took on the role of a different colonial power and were challenged with the task of partitioning Africa. Things started out smoothly as they were able to claim the land that they wanted based on the resources available in the area; however, it became more difficult as less land was available and more countries joined the "scramble". Students were able to experience historical globalization through the lens of an imperialist country and reflect on the effects the practices of these countries had on the different regions of Africa.



Social 20 - Paris Peace Conference

The grade 11 students have been learning about national interest by studying World War I and World War II, as well as the interwar period. Each student was assigned a country involved in the wars and examined the wars from that country's perspective. They participated in a simulation of the Paris Peace Conference during the Interwar Period and were tasked with the challenge of creating the Treaty of Versailles. Some students experienced the frustrations involved with having unequal power, while others understood the danger of unchecked power and control. As a result, students gained a deeper understanding of the causes of World War II.

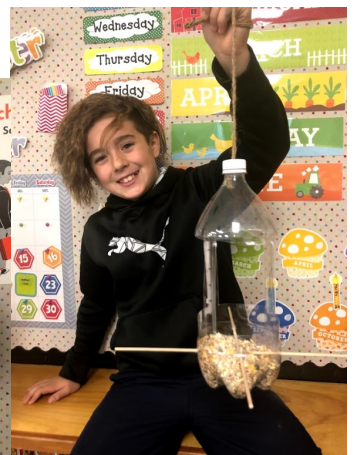

Grade 4's Pop Bottle Birdfeeders

As an end to our science unit, Waste and Our World, the grade 4 students designed and constructed birdfeeders out of recycled materials. They were challenged to find a design on the internet that would use a plastic bottle to make a birdfeeder.

- Once students decided how they wanted their birdfeeder to look and function, Mrs. Saruk helped them to construct their designs. Students were able to take home their project and a bag of birdseed.
- Students enjoyed re-using something disposable to create something new that could help the environment.





Grade 2-3 class

On November 21, the grade 2/3 class embarked on their second virtual field trip. This time, we travelled to Tunisia, Africa. There, we got to see a variety of places, and watch a young boy participate in a camel race. We saw how Tunisia has a variety of landscapes, from desert, to ocean, and many historical ruins. We got to see a woman weaving a mergoum (traditional patterned cloth) using a hand-loom, and using yarn hand made from sheep's wool. Finally, we also got to learn a bit about some of the festivals, traditions and customs of the people who live in Tunisia. We had a whole lot of fun, and earned a new stamp in our passports!

Wow! December is here already! I am so excited watching the students' growth as they achieve their goals! Our first AR period is done. Students who met their goal received a book mark from the **Scholastic Book Fair**. The students are working hard at achieving their second goal. Any students who make their second goal will be invited to a pancake lunch at the end of the reporting period.



In the last 30 days, our students from grades 2 - 12 have read a total of 685 books and 6,888,311 words! **WAY TO GO!!** 46% of our students took at least 1 quiz and 56% of our students averaged 85% or higher! This is **Great** news!! We are definitely a school filled with reading rock stars!

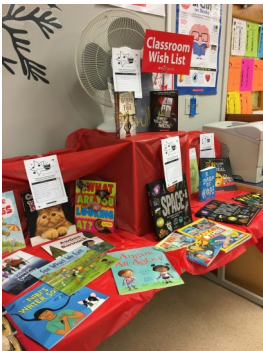

Outdoor Education in November

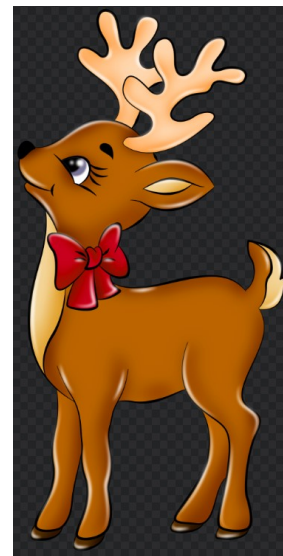

I still have asthma symptoms after using my asthma medicine (and call 911 if I'm having trouble breathing after using an inhaler).

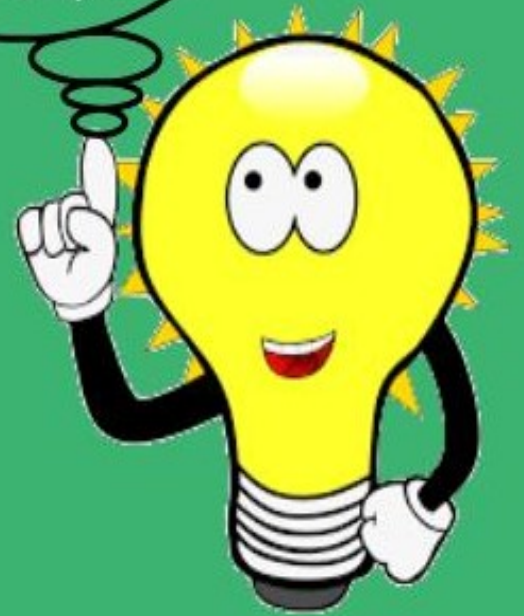
